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CHICANO PARK

Significant historical events and notable Mexican figures such as Cesar Chavez and Frida Kahlo appear in more than 80 vibrant murals at this public park beneath the San Diego-Coronado Bridge. It was named as a National Historic Landmark in 2017 and celebrates almost 50 years of Chicano culture and community in Barrio Logan.

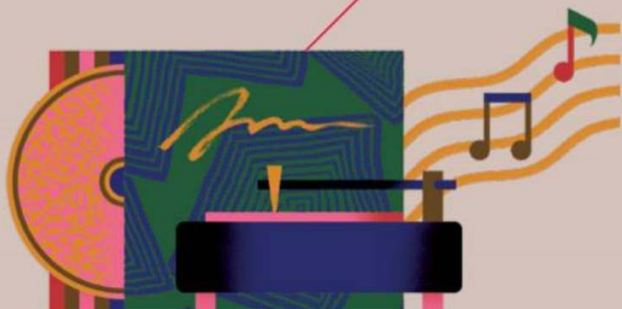


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BASILEIE

BEAT BOX RECORDS

Crate-diggers will love the vintage vinyl selection of mid-20th-century jazz, soul, funk and everything in between at this snug neighborhood shop. Its treasure trove of hard-to-find discs are all sourced by the owner, long-time collector and occasional DJ Bernie Fishman.

EL CARRITO

Housed in a 1930s-era trolley car, this historic eatery (whose owners also run neighbouring coffee shop Por Vida) specialises in Mexican breakfast staples such as *huevos rancheros*, pork *machaca* and *chilaquiles*. Don't miss the *menudo* served with hand-pressed tortillas on the weekends.

LA BODEGA GALLERY

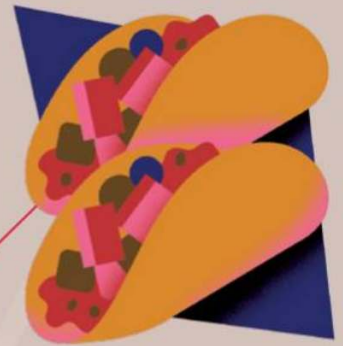
Warehouse-turned-gallery and culture hub La Bodega hosts a wide range of exhibitions, screenings and performances. Its annual *Día De Los Muertos* Skull Art Show is a must-see during the Mexican Day of the Dead festival (31 October – 2 November).

¡SALUD!

A Barrio staple since 2015, this former taco-truck turned bricks and mortar is a go-to for some of the city's best tacos. The signature *abuelita*-style taco is a flour tortilla filled with stewed beef and topped with *nopales* (cactus pads) and sour cream.

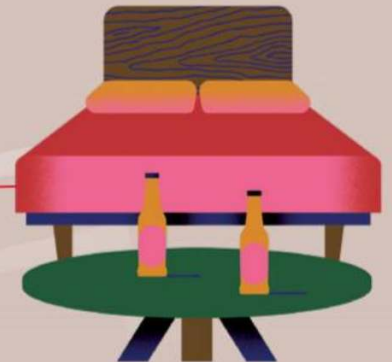

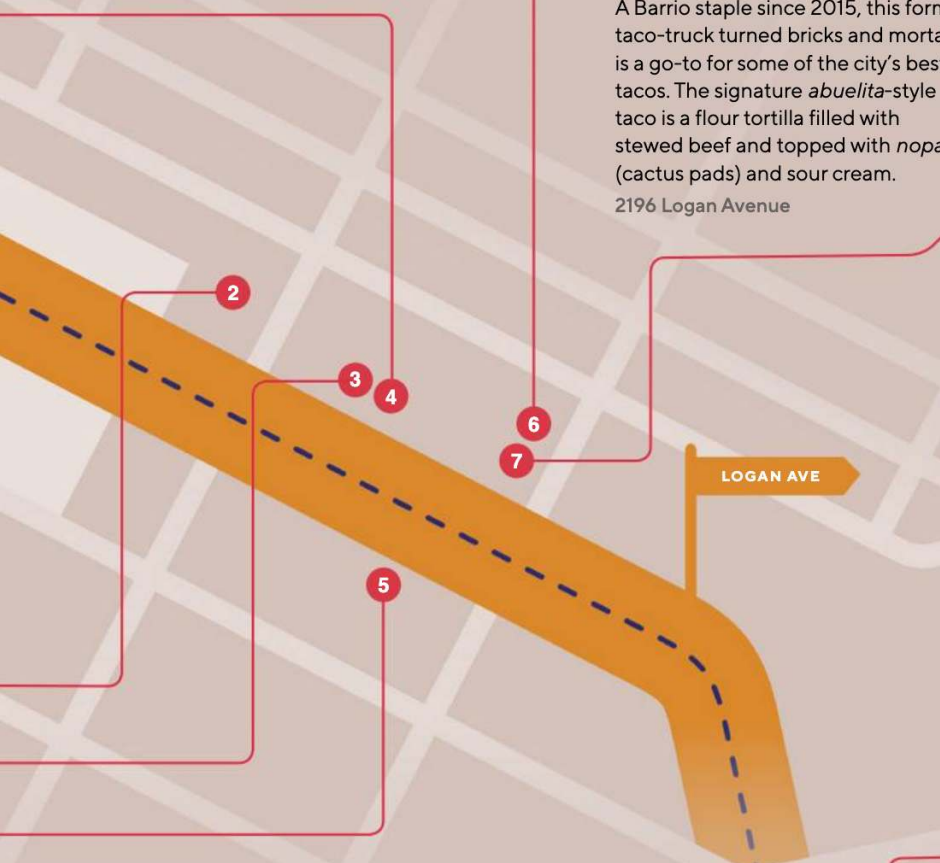
